Mandats importants

- *R v Peepetch*, 2019. Secured Saskatchewan's first order for a Government-funded "Gladue" report.
- *Eaton v University of Regina*, 2019. Successfully opposed University's application for a closed-door hearing related to professor's access to information request.
- *R v Necroche*, 2018. At trial, client was convicted of criminal offence while represented by other counsel. Conviction quashed on appeal, and sent back for new trial.
- *Nelson v Saskatchewan Human Rights Commission*, 2017. Successfully brought an application to have the Commission's discretionary decision overturned on account of being unreasonable.
- *Zimmermann v Saskatchewan (Ministry of Agriculture)*, 2016. Province cancelled client's farm lease while he was unrepresented. My judicial review of this decision led to a new hearing.
