New Societies Act

- Societies Act
 - New Societies Act in force November 28, 2016
 - Repeals and replaces current Society Act



Corporate Governance Procedures

- Default governance provisions
 - Similar to those under BC Business Corporations Act
- General Meetings
 - Timing for AGM
 - Deemed AGM
 - Location



Corporate and Governance Procedures

- General Meetings
 - Calling general meetings
 - Requisition by directors
 - Requisition by members
 - Notice Requirements
 - At least 14 days before & not more than 60 days before
 - If 250+ members and in bylaws, notice may be given by:
 - E-mail to members who have provided e-mail address &:
 - » Posting it in a newspaper identified in bylaws, or
 - » Posting it on a website maintained by the society



Corporate and Governance Procedures

- General Meetings
 - Greater member participation rights
 - Proxy voting
 - Participation by electronic means



Corporate and Governance Procedures

- Increased internal governance options
 - Multiple classes of membership
 - 2/3 threshold for special resolutions

Financial Reporting & Remuneration

Remuneration

- Director remuneration only allowed if bylaws permit
 - No director remuneration for charities
- Limits on number of directors remunerated under contracts of employment or contracts for services
- Public disclosure of director/employee compensation
- Threshold for disclosing employee compensation is \$75,000



Record Keeping

- List of documents that must be kept
- Can dispose after 10 years
- Location: registered address or other place in BC
- Electronic format permitted



Inspection of Records

- Can restrict members' access to certain records:
 - Directors' resolutions, accounting records, members' register
 - In camera minutes?

Director Appointment

- Qualifications for directors
 - 18 years of age or older (can be 16 or 17 if Bylaws permit)
 - No recent convictions for fraud
 - Not an undischarged bankrupt
 - Not mentally incapable
- Director consent or presence for election
- Ex Officio Directors

Director Liability

- Directors personally liable for improper distribution of money or property
 - 2 year limitation period
 - Due diligence defense
- Director indemnification
 - No longer subject to court approval
- Relief of directors in legal proceedings

Senior Managers

- Directors may delegate management powers to senior managers
 - Can be a director
 - Qualifications
 - Duties
 - Indemnification

Member Rights

Member Proposals

- 5% of voting members (unless bylaws set lower %)
- Send notice of matter they want considered at AGM
- Procedure:
 - Notice must include names of members (and be signed)
 - Must not exceed 200 words
 - Must be received at least 7 days before notice of AGM is sent

Member Rights

- Unalterable Provisions
 - Ability to alter the unalterable provisions in constitution
 - Some societies need consent of designated minister

Member Rights

- Oppression remedy
 - Activities of society conducted in manner oppressive to member; or
 - Act of the society was done or threatened that is unfairly prejudicial to the member
- Court has broad powers

Member-Funded Societies

- Member-Funded Societies
 - Relaxed regulatory burden
 - Distribution of assets to members on liquidation
 - Financial statements not publicly accessible
 - No disclosure of director remuneration
 - No limit on number of directors remunerated
 - Single director
 - No residency requirement for director

Member-Funded Societies

- Disqualified if:
 - Registered charity
 - Student society
 - Hospital society
 - Designated by regulations
- Examples:
 - Sports clubs
 - Professional organizations

Member-Funded Societies

- "Publicly Funded" Societies
 - Subject to current Society Act requirements respecting directors, financial statements and distribution of assets on dissolution
 - Increased regulatory burden
 - Majority of directors must not employed or under contract
 - Disclosure of director remuneration
 - Disclosure of remuneration of highest paid employees
 - Public inspection of financial statements



Other Changes – Removal of Directors

- Directors can now be removed from office by any method in the bylaws
- Not restricted to a member vote

Other Changes – Borrowing

- Society may not issue debentures unless authorized by special resolution (Society Act)
 - Debenture = Mortgage?
- Can borrow money and issue bonds, debentures or notes as directors determine (Societies Act)
 - Bylaws can restrict directors' powers

Transition Period

- Two year transition period from November 28, 2016
- Act applies except for:
 - Director remuneration, qualifications and consents

What existing societies need to do

Transition Application

- File transition application within two years of November 28, 2016
 - Constitution
 - Name and Purposes
 - Member-funded society? (on transition or by court order)

What existing societies need to do

- Transition Application (cont.)
 - Bylaws
 - Existing bylaws (subject to any desired amendments)
 - Any unalterable provisions in existing Constitution
 - Reporting society provisions
 - Statement of directors
 - Name and address
 - Registered office of society

What existing societies need to do

- If a registered charity, need to update CRA
- File a certified copy of the new Constitution and Bylaws

What existing extraprovincial non-share corporations need to do

- If registered, automatic transition
- Now all extraprovincial non-share corporations that carry on activities in BC must register
 - Pre-existing extraprovincial non-share corporations have 2 years
- If not registered, fine may be imposed

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
